Third Sunday of Advent

From the desk of Fr. Phil

The 'O ANTIPHONS' Advent week 3 – December 16-17, 2017

The O Antiphons refer to the seven Antiphons that are recited, or chanted, preceding the Magnificat during Evening Prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours in the Breviary. The 'O Antiphons' are chanted in the verses of the famous Advent Hymn, O Come, O Come, Emmanuel. They cover a special period of Advent preparation known as the Octave before Christmas, December 17 – 24. Each Antiphon addresses Jesus with a unique title which comes from the prophecies of Isaiah and Micah. The original Latin titles are: Sapientia, (O WISDOM), Adonai, (O LORD OF ISRAEL), Radix Jesse, (O ROOT OF JESSE), Clavis David, (O KEY OF DAVID), Oriens, (O RADIANT



DAWN), Rex Gentium, (O KING OF ALL NATIONS), Emmanuel, (O GOD WITH US). Notice when they are read in reverse order, the first letter of each Antiphon forms the word, Eros Cras, which, when translated means, Tomorrow I will Come, referring to the birth of Christ. On the 24th Of December, Christmas Eve, the Church uses the prayers for the vigil of Christmas. The exact origin of these Antiphons is not known but it is thought that they were recited in the Benedictine Monasteries in France between 480 and 524. In the 8th Century, they were in use in Rome during liturgical celebrations. We can conclude that they have been an important part of our Advent liturgies for a long time. So the 'O Antiphons' not only bring intensity to our Advent celebrations and preparation, they bring the season of Advent to a joyful conclusion. I hope that you will enjoy praying these short antiphons in anticipation of the birth of Christ. They are said directly before praying the Magnificat, Mary's Prayer of thanksgiving. I have included this prayer for you with the insert of fridge prayers for week four of Advent.

Kindergarten Registration 8, 2018 begins January Parents/Guardians can now register students online

Kindergarten registration for the 2018-19 school year will begin on January 8, 2018. Dufferin-Peel offers the full-day Kindergarten program in all 123 Catholic elementary schools in Mississauga, Brampton, Caledon, Bolton and Orangeville.

This year, parents/guardians have the option to register online or in-person at their designated Catholic school. Online registration will begin on January 8, 2018 at www.dpcdsb.org. The Online Registration Form should be completed prior to in-person school meetings where documentation will be received on January 15* from 7:00 p.m. -9:00 p.m. and January 17-19 from 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. *A snow date has been designated on January 16 from 7:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. If parents/guardians wish to register in-person, they may do so during these specified dates and times.

The following documents are required for registration:

- Registration Form (completed online copies also available at the school)
- proof of age of the child (birth certificate or passport)
- Original Roman Catholic baptismal certificate (for child and/or parent/guardian) or original baptismal certificate from an Eastern Church in full communion with the Holy See of Rome. If the child has not been baptized, and the parent/guardian is a baptized Roman Catholic or has been baptized in an Eastern Church in full communion with the Holy See of Rome, the parent/guardian must bring their own original baptismal certificate.
- updated immunization records (Immunization Card, Peel Health Form or Letter of Exemption)
- proof of Canadian citizenship (Birth Certificate/Passport) or permanent resident status
- proof of home address (two of the following: property tax bill, current utility bill, real estate document or Government of Canada issued forms)
- emergency rural address numbers for property identification, if applicable (residents of Caledon and Dufferin County)
- proof of English Separate School Support (may be done at the time of registration by completing an Application For the Direction of School Support and/or a Separate School Lease Agreement available at the school)

Major Relic of St. Francis Xavier to visit the Archdiocese of Toronto

A first-degree relic of missionary Saint Francis Xavier is coming to the Archdiocese of Toronto, January 12-14, 2018. The forearm of the saint, permanently displayed at the Church of the Gesù in Rome, will be in Canada from December 29 - February 2, as part of a 14-city Canadian visit. In our archdiocese, the relic will be hosted by St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica (Jan. 12), St. Francis Xavier Church, Mississauga (Jan. 13) and Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Toronto (January 14). Organizers believe this is the first time the relic has been on Canadian soil. The body of St. Francis Xavier, which is buried in Goa, India, as well as the relic of his arm, are incorrupt-they have not experienced natural decay since his death in 1552. Organizers expect close to 100,000 people will visit the various events across the country-the same number of people it is believed Francis baptized with his right arm and hand.
