

Divine Mercy Novena at St. Dominic's Parish

Following Sunday after Easter that is April 28 is Divine Mercy Sunday. Prior to the Feast of Divine Mercy, we begin Divine Mercy Novena and the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy at St. Dominic's Church from Good Friday after the 3pm service and every day after the Mass. We request you to join us for this beautiful devotion to Divine Mercy of Jesus.

Divine Mercy Sunday

Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska was born in Glogowiec, Poland. She was the third of ten children and given the name Helena at baptism. Sister Maria Faustina was 19 when she had a vision from Jesus who told her to go to Warsaw and join a convent. Sister Maria Faustina spent her early convent years in Warsaw, Vilnius (Lithuania) and Plock. During that time, as well as following the convents rigorous daily prayer life, she also carried out general house duties.



Sister Maria Faustina continued to receive the visions from Jesus and kept a diary. Jesus asked her to make a painting of how \mbox{He}

appeared to her. Sister Faustina was unable to do this immediately but, a few years later and with the help of an artist, the now well known image of the "King of Divine Mercy" was completed. The painting depicted Jesus wearing a white cloak with a white and red ray of light originating at his heart and spreading out towards his feet. At the bottom of the painting were the words, "Jesus, I Trust in You". Sister Faustina wrote in her diary on 13th September 1935, the purpose of the Chaplet Prayers is threefold; to obtain mercy, to trust in God's Divine Mercy and to show mercy to others. Sister Maria Faustina died on 5th October 1938 aged 33yrs. Her body is interred in the Basilica of Divine Mercy, Krakow, Poland. She was canonized a Saint by Pope John Paul II on 30 April 2000.

March for Life


May 9, 2019 marks the 50^{th} year of abortion in Canada – at the cost of 100,000 innocent lives each year across Canada!

Divine Mercy



- Say the "Eternal Social Social
- Say 10 Fol the sake of Fils softowful Passion on the "Hail Mary" beads.
 Repeat for four more decades equipe "Exercise"
- 8. Repeat for four more decades, saying "Eternal Father" on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the Sake of His sorrowful Passion" on the following "Hail Mary" beads.
- At the conclusion of the five decades, on the medallion say the "Holy God," the concluding doxology, three times.
- 10. Say the optional Closing Prayer.

A novena is typically nine days of prayer in preparation of a celebration of a feast day. The Chaplet can be said anytime, but the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena. He promised, "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls."

For each of the nine days, our Lord gave Saint Faustina a different intention:

All mankind, especially sinners; the souls of priests and religious; all devout and faithful souls; those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Jesus; the souls who have separated themselves from the Church; the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children; the souls who especially venerate and glorify His mercy; the souls detained in purgatory; and souls who have become lukewarm.

"I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw therefrom strength and refreshment and whatever grace they have need of in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209).


