REFLECTIONS

Readings:

Isaiah 50.4-7

Philippians 2.6-11

Mathew 26.14-27.66

We enter today into this Holy Week, and in the Gospel passage that we just heard, we relive the last days and final hours of our Lord Jesus Christ’s earthly life. The Gospel is written so that we become “witnesses.” We become part of the story. So, today we go with our Lord up to Jerusalem for the Passover festival. We have a seat at the table as he celebrates his last supper, and we witness the drama of his betrayal. We try to keep watch with him in the garden, and we are there when the mob comes to arrest him. We witness the mockery of his trial, the cruelty of the soldiers, the falling away of his closest disciples. And finally, we walk alongside our Lord, with Mary our Blessed Mother, as he carries his cross and is crucified.

So as we begin this Holy Week, let’s ask for the grace to enter into these mysteries in a deep and personal way. Let us truly accompany Jesus and Mary our Blessed Mother on this final journey. As we walk this path with Jesus and Mary, we remember that everything that happens in these final moments of our Lord’s earthly life — happens according to God’s plan of salvation.

And we know the “end of the story.” Our Gospel today ends with our Lord suffering and dying on the cross, feeling abandoned and alone. Everything appears to be lost — but it’s not! And we know that. The victory is already won. God wins in the end! St. Paul tells us today in the second reading: “*Christ Jesus ... humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him.*”

PASCAL TRIDUUM



The **Easter Triduum** or **Holy Triduum** is the three-day celebration of the **Paschal Mystery**: the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Paschal: associated with the Hebrew Passover; referring to Jesus as the Lamb of God

Triduum: derived from the Latin for three days.

As Christians, we embrace ‘paschal’ as the passage of Jesus Christ through his passion and death to the new life of the resurrection.

These are the three **holiest** days of our liturgical year and bridge the seasons of Lent to Easter.

We enter deeply into the various facets of the Paschal Mystery through liturgical worship, prayerful devotion, and other customs.

Holy Thursday: “Jesus gives himself to us as food and, in the washing of the feet teaches us the need to serve other.”

Good Friday: “In the mystery of Christ’s death on the cross, we contemplate that undying love which embraces all mankind and summons us in turn to love one another in the power of the Spirit.”

Holy Saturday: “The day of God’s silence – invites us not only to solidarity with all who are abandoned and alone, but also to trust in the faithful love which turns death into life.” SOURCE: POPE FRANCIS GENERAL AUDIENCE, MARCH 23, 2016

NEW FUNDING CAMPAIGNS

We have two new funding campaigns and last week we distributed pledge cards for parishioners to complete. Please return the pledge cards to the parish office or place it in the collection basket or in the donation boxes at the front of the church. Also please remember to record your envelope number and your name on the pledge card for better tracking.

The first campaign is the capital campaign for items such as upgrading the parking lot, the furnace and the parish sound system and lighting. Our parish was built in 1957 and some of the items are way overdue for upgrades as the church is almost 70 years old. The parking lot has been cited by the Archdiocese as a potential safety hazard.

The second campaign is a loan repayment initiative. As presented in the 2021 financial statements there are outstanding loans payable to the Archdiocese of \$581,000. The Archdiocese has graciously allowed a matching program for our loan repayment campaign and a dollar for dollar match up to \$200,000. That means if we raise \$200,000, the Archdiocese will match that \$200,000 for a total repayment of \$400,000.

The proceeds of these two campaigns will go directly to supporting St. Dominic's. With the Family of Faith campaign that was started in 2015, only 25% of the amounts went towards St. Dominic's and the remainder went to the Archdiocese. We are hoping parishioners would contribute to these campaigns in the same capacity as they donated to the Family of Faith campaign.

Working together we can make these two campaigns a success.
