Third Sunday of Easter REFLECTIONS

Readings: Acts 2.14,22b-28 1Peter 1.17-21 Luke 24.13-35

As Jesus interpreted to them the things about himself in all the Scriptures their hearts burning within themselves. The Scriptures is where we find meaning for all human suffering. When we struggle in finding the meaning of our own pain and loss, we should reflect and meditate on the Scriptures again and again. Christians do not only read the whole Bible one time and then put it back on the bookshelves. But, in whatever we do, we have to remember the Bible. Whenever we make our own decisions, we have to reflect on the Bible. I believe the Word of God really gives Christians the hope they need when they deal with their human weaknesses.

The two disciples' eyes were opened when, at the dinner table, Jesus broke the bread, said the blessing and gave it to them. This action reminded them that, in the past, Jesus fed the hungry crowd with five loaves and two fish. So, they never forget what Jesus did when He was still with them on earth. Their eyes were opened and they recognized who was with them all day on the road. They remembered what Jesus taught them on the road. So, "remember" is the theme of this Sunday's Gospel. Do you remember how Jesus healed you in the past? Do you remember how you met Jesus in the Sacrament of Baptism, Confession, and the Holy Eucharist? Most importantly, do you remember who you were before you met Jesus, and who are you now after you have met Jesus and believe in Him? Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, Jesus' disciples cannot grow in faith if we do not remember Him !

April 22nd – April 29th, 2023 NEW FUNDING CAMPAIGNS

We have two new funding campaigns and we distributed pledge cards for parishioners to complete. Please return the pledge cards to the parish office or place it in the collection basket or in the donation boxes at the front of the church. Also please remember to record your envelope number and your name on the pledge card for better tracking.



The first campaign is the capital campaign for items

such as upgrading the parking lot, the furnace and the parish sound system and lighting. Our parish was built in 1957 and some of the items are way overdue for upgrades as the church is almost 70 years old. The parking lot has been cited by the Archdiocese as a potential safety hazard.

The second campaign is a loan repayment initiative. As presented in the 2021 financial statements there are outstanding loans payable to the Archdiocese of \$581,000. The Archdiocese has graciously allowed a matching program for our loan repayment campaign and a dollar for dollar match up to \$200,000. That means if we raise \$200,000, the Archdiocese will match that \$200,000 for a total repayment of \$400,000.

The proceeds of these two campaigns will go directly to supporting St. Dominic's. With the Family of Faith campaign that was started in 2015, only 25% of the amounts went towards St. Dominic's and the remainder went to the Archdiocese. We are hoping parishioners would contribute to these campaigns in the same capacity as they donated to the Family of Faith campaign.

Working together we can make these two campaigns a success.
